CBRE University Scholarship

Award Description

Purpose and Recognition	<p>This award recognises outstanding achievement in studies related to the construction industry.</p> <p>This award recognises outstanding female students in New South Wales who have the potential to significantly contribute to the construction industry in the future. The successful recipient will receive a \$3,000 scholarship toward future education and training.</p>
Eligibility	<p>Female university (undergraduate or post graduate) student attending a New South Wales tertiary institution, currently undertaking a course related to the construction industry.</p>

How to Nominate

1. Register online and enter all details on the online entry page.
2. You must read and agree to be bound by the NAWIC Terms and Conditions of Nomination. NAWIC reserves the right to accept nominations in its absolute discretion.
3. Complete online submission, within the word count specified to address each assessment criteria below.
4. The online entry must include the following:
 - a. Nominee details entered online;
 - b. Nominee biography entered online;
 - c. Assessment criteria submission entered online;
 - d. Letter of endorsement uploaded;
 - e. Good quality image of nominee or nominee team uploaded (this image will be used in the Awards presentation event);
 - f. Letter or other evidence confirming employment or enrolment.

If the nominee for this Award is successful, the nominee must provide a written summary to the Sponsor and NAWIC outlining how the nominee intends to utilise the scholarship, for approval. Once approved, payment will be made direct to the relevant organisation and the nominee must report to the Sponsor and NAWIC the outcomes before 1 July 2019.

Assessment Criteria

Nominees will be assessed in accordance with the following assessment criteria:

1. The authenticity and quality of response to criteria above.
2. The nominee's unique understanding of how and why women will contribute to the success of the construction industry in the nominee's lifetime.
3. The nominee's quality of work on a university assignment / assessment and overall academic results.
4. The nominee's ability to overcome challenges or adversity.
5. The nominee's commitment and contribution to the construction industry.

6. Any other matters or circumstances identified by the nominee and relevant to the Purpose and Recognition for this award, stated above.

The nominee must address the following in the nominee's submission:

1. What inspired the nominee to enrol in a course related to the construction industry?
2. Provide an outline of the nominee's long term career aspirations, role models and how the nominee believes women will contribute to a positive future for the construction industry.
3. Provide a written reference from a lecturer or tutor in support of the nominee that confirms the nominee is a student currently enrolled in a New South Wales tertiary institution.
4. Provide the nominee's curriculum vitae including details of any education, employment or other experience relevant to the nominee's participation in the construction industry. Include details of any industry awards or outstanding academic results achieved and further contributions to university life (maximum 4 pages).
5. Provide an outline as to how the nominee will utilise the scholarship.
